94 Q: So, uh, I'm sorry (unintelligible) work. Uh, I think it...

96 A: Okay.

98 Q: Um, so obviously you (unintelligible). So you've have (unintelligible). Um,
99 and I'm sure you're aware of...

101 A: (Unintelligible).

103 Q: ...records requests that were made.
104
105 A: Yes.
106
107 Q: You're - so you're aware of all that?
108
109 A: I mean a bad divorce.
110
111 Q: Right.
112
113 A: (Unintelligible).
114
115 Q: Okay.
116
117 Q: Well there's a lot of other people that have information. And they eventually
118 came to us.
119
120 A: Okay.
121
122 Q: So we have to follow up with you. You know, that this is not somethin' that
123 we want to be doin' but just like you got there's two sides to every story.
124
125 A: Sure.
126
127 Q: So, um, there were some records request filed and then I guess there were
128 people that have reached out to other people including your ex-wife.
129
130 A: Yeah.
131
132 Q: Um, I have spoken to these people. I have spoken to your ex-wife.
133
134 A: Okay.
135

136 Q: 'Kay? There's a lot of things that came up. There's a lot of things that are not
137 within the realm of law enforcement, okay? There are some other things that I
138 need to ask you about.
139
140 A: Okay.
141
142 Q: Okay? So initially, um, there was an incident I guess there is three kids that
143 your wife was friends, uh, there was a grandmother and she has basically
144 stated that you solicited her three kids to have - to babysit. To get these three
145 kids and give 'em basically sleeping pills to do sexual things to them.
146
147 A: Oh, my God.
148
149 Q: Now she said she's - to not do this or anything like that. But obviously she's
150 saying these kids are in the district. Do you see our concern?
151
152 A: Yeah.
153
154 Q: So.
155
156 A: Never happened?
157
158 Q: Never happened? Okay. And what about pictures, things sent back and forth
159 of younger kids?
160
161 A: Never happened.
162
163 Q: Never happened?
164
165 A: No.
166
167 Q: Okay.
168
169 A: Do I need an attorney
170
171 Q: That is up to you. But like I said I - there's two sides to every story. But I do
172 have - and she also mentioned another incident involving your son [REDACTED]
173 when he had some friends over where you wanted to - her to get sexually
174 active.
175
176 A: This is totally flipped.
177
178 Q: Okay. Did - tell me. Like I said I know there's two sides.
179
180 A: Okay.

181
182 Q: We deal with these a lot. So...
183
184 A: I can tell you she's crazy.
185
186 Q: Okay.
187
188 A: Um, she's had mental health issues. And I'm, like, um...
189
190 Q: Okay.
191
192 A: Um.
193
194 Q: Look and that's - and then like I said...
195
196 A: She gets me to play games. She got me to play games. She got me to, um, say
197 things. She got me to arrange, um, her and other guys.
198
199 Q: Mm-hm.
200
201 A: Like, and I'm just...
202
203 Q: Okay. Now were you involved in that as well?
204
205 A: How so?
206
207 Q: Actively involved?
208
209 A: I mean we both were.
210
211 Q: Okay.
212
213 A: But...
214
215 Q: No I appreciate - I appreciate the honesty.
216
217 A: Never minors.
218
219 Q: Okay. And that's - and like I said that's - that's none of our...
220
221 A: She - she liked to role play.
222
223 Q: Sure.
224
225 A: And everything else.

226
227 Q: Okay. Now I do have concern. There's a text message where she...
228
229 A: Okay.
230
231 Q: ...she references and I'll read you the whole text message here.
232
233 A: Sure.
234
235 Q: I've turned my back on my ethics [REDACTED] There are things we have done. I felt
236 awful and uncomfortable. Pictures of little kids. You're talkin' to me about
237 havin' sex with [REDACTED] and his friends, me in a gang bang, glory hole sex
238 clubs. So much it felt so wrong. You say it's all pillow talk -- and this is
239 where it looks bad -- you say I'm sorry.
240
241 A: I'm - it was - I mean I have other messages from her that I could show.
242
243 Q: It's - if...
244
245 A: (Unintelligible).
246
247 Q: No it's she's - no. If she's taking shit out of context...
248
249 A: She's taking shit out of context
250
251 Q: ...to make - to make you look bad...
252
253 A: Right.
254
255 Q: ...I'll deal with that. But do you have those text messages that will show?
256
257 A: None. I probably have emails, but I don't think I would have text messages.
258
259 Q: Okay.
260
261 A: Can I see it?
262
263 Q: Yeah.
264
265 A: Okay. We don't have pictures of little kids. That's bullshit.
266
267 Q: But there was nothing, like, nudist colony stuff that were sent back and forth?
268
269 A: Not that I'm aware of. I mean she could've sent 'em to me but...
270

271 Q: Okay. And like I said I know there's two sides.
272
273 A: Yeah.
274
275 Q: You know what I mean? And I hate - I hate even getting...
276
277 A: No I appreciate you coming to me. I'm just telling you.
278
279 Q: But I'm - I'm telling you this. We're - we're kind of doing this as a courtesy
280 because I know don't know who all else she's been talking to. But people
281 came to me and brought me a bunch of information.
282
283 A: I - I - I get that.
284
285 Q: So that's why, you know, and I can see with an ex or something how things go
286 sideways.
287
288 A: Yeah.
289
290 Q: But, you know, this - this doesn't look good. And if you've got something that
291 can disprove that it may...
292
293 A: I mean I could send you...
294
295 Q: And I'd love to have that.
296
297 A: I mean I could go back and look but, like, basically the emails I mean...
298
299 Q: I mean can you give just roughly what's in these emails? With (unintelligible).
300
301 A: Her wanting me to set up things with men. Me wanting to treat her as a daddy.
302
303 Q: Mm-hm.
304
305 A: And then her being a - a - a submissive.
306
307 Q: Sure.
308
309 A: That whole thing. Um...
310
311 Q: Okay.
312
313 A: She sent me, um, videos of her having sex with other men. She has sent me
314 videos of her having sex with other men in my son's bedroom. That type of
315 thing.

316
317 Q: Okay. Now did you - and I - I - and I know this is uncomfortable. This is
318 personal business stuff that, you know, but like I said I felt it right to get your
319 side because...
320
321 A: No I - I appreciate that.
322
323 Q: ...obviously, you know, there has been people lookin' into you. And I know
324 in your position you're not gonna have natural enemies. It's just the way it is.
325
326 A: I get that.
327
328 Q: Um, but like, did you set up stuff from an account, uh, like, just in case? Does
329 it - does that sound familiar? Where you would arrange stuff? Where you put,
330 uh, craigslist ads?
331
332 A: Yeah we both did that.
333
334 Q: Okay.
335
336 A: She'd get on my computer and she would go in as me, too.
337
338 Q: Okay.
339
340 A: (Unintelligible).
341
342 Q: Do you still have that account? Is that active?
343
344 A: Uh, I've not been on - we have not been on in years.
345
346 Q: Yeah. Okay.
347
348 A: (Unintelligible) since we split before that.
349
350 Q: Okay. But you're tellin' me there's no pictures that were sent back and forth
351 that maybe she might've sent them to you?
352
353 A: If she did I wouldn't have kept them or saved them.
354
355 Q: Okay.
356
357 A: I mean she sent me videos of her having sex with men. I never sent her any
358 videos of me having sex with other people. And I mean the last...
359
360 Q: Okay.

361
362 A: The last time I was with my attorney...
363
364 Q: Okay.
365
366 A: ...when we we're goin' through the divorce so.
367
368 Q: Okay. So your attorney has that stuff on file then?
369
370 A: She does.
371
372 Q: Okay. Um, 'cause I like said, you know, there's - there's other people lookin'
373 and - and this was...
374
375 A: (Unintelligible).
376
377 Q: ...just to come you know what I mean? At least 'cause we have a duty to act.
378 You know, with, you know, it - was there ever anything where it was like you
379 talk about role playing or anything like that where children...
380
381 A: She...
382
383 Q: ...might've been...
384
385 A: She...
386
387 Q: ...brought up?
388
389 A: She liked to role play that a lot. I mean she liked to be the whole little girl
390 with the daddy thing. And she would...
391
392 Q: Mm-hm.
393
394 A: She'd like that from other men, too. And so she would send me that.
395
396 Q: Okay.
397
398 A: Um, she had me read stuff before about, like, little and older and stuff like that
399 as - as a roleplay thing. She did.
400
401 Q1: And we - we get the role playing. I mean that - that's between you guys. Role
402 playing never hurt anybody.
403
404 A: No it was...
405

406 Q1: Our biggest concern is hey we're not - she's - 'cause I mean we have - I've
407 been gettin' flooded. As you can tell my post-it notes here flooded with
408 things.
409
410 A: Probably text messages.
411
412 Q1: And not just - [REDACTED] not just one person. I mean and I get - and I get it. One
413 I've been through a divorce so I get it. They come out of the woodwork. But,
414 you know, we go and talk to everybody and when everybody has somethin'
415 we just wanna make sure that, you know, there's more stuff we're getting it.
416 We're not gonna get a cell phone record from you.
417
418 A: There's no smoking gun.
419
420 Q1: Yeah. There's not gonna be any kid photos sent from...
421
422 A No.
423
424 Q1: ...you or anything that we're gonna find 'cause...
425
426 Q: No we're not gonna get anything comin' to her phone from you as far as
427 kiddie pictures?
428
429 A: I mean not...
430
431 Q: Yeah.
432
433 A: Not that I can...
434
435 Q: Okay.
436
437 A: ...tell you or - or - or whatever. I mean.
438
439 Q: Okay.
440
441 Q1: I would think you would remember if there was kid photos.
442
443 A: I would...
444
445 Q: Yeah absolutely.
446
447 A: ...think so, too.
448
449 Q: Um...
450

451 A: Um, but, like, I know you're gonna get my side of this. But it's, like, the shit
452 you have, like, on me so to speak I've got, like...
453
454 Q1: Oh, I'm sure.
455
456 A: (Unintelligible).
457
458 Q1: And that's why we came here.
459
460 A: And I'm, like...
461
462 Q1: No.
463
464 A: ...should I send it to you now? Like, I'm scared to, like...
465
466 Q: Well and, uh, that's why we're havin' a conversation. You know what I
467 mean? And I hated to do it at work. You know what I mean?
468
469 A: Sure.
470
471 Q: But...
472
473 A: Better you askin' me now then later or whatever.
474
475 Q: But, you know, like I said there - there's other people that got information. I
476 don't really know what the motivations are. I'm - I'm not a political person.
477
478 A: This is my crazy board member. It's probably people that are whatever. But...
479
480 Q: Right.
481
482 A: She's had mental health issues. She's had counseling. She wrote - she's wrote
483 - wrote letters before, um, acting as somebody else and sending them to our
484 home. Um, that's happened several times where she'll - she'll, um, write a
485 letter and have it mailed to us making it look like she's the victim.
486
487 Q: Mm-hm.
488
489 A: So that's - that's happened so.
490
491 Q: So she - is this while you were livin' here?
492
493 A: Uh, no in our - in our previous city (unintelligible) a long time, too.
494
495 Q: Okay.

496
497 Q1: She would just act like a random person that you guys have never...
498
499 A: (Unintelligible) person. It was somebody that so, like a...
500
501 Q1: Hardly dealt with or had...
502
503 A: The first one was somebody that she had a falling out with.
504
505 Q1: Gotcha.
506
507 A: And then they sent anonymous letters to people in the, um, in the town that we
508 were in. And it made it look like she was the victim. And then I found the
509 letters, like, shredded in our shredder.
510
511 Q1: Like I say...
512
513 A: (Unintelligible).
514
515 Q1: ...what made you think it was her? Is that just gut feelin' or?
516
517 A: Gut feelin' and...
518
519 Q: I'm with you.
520
521 A: ...she's got issues. And so I remember, like, lookin' on computers and stuff
522 and couldn't find anything and then found, um, in a shredder. And this is, um,
523 probably 10 years ago. But right down in the bottom of the shredder pieces of
524 the - of the letters so.
525
526 Q: Yeah.
527
528 A: You know, confronted, um, that. I mean we - we've gotten counseling,
529 confronted her in counseling. Should've got a divorce then. But obviously
530 didn't so.
531
532 Q: So now, like, if we - if I - and I don't know how that - you know what I mean?
533 This - this is far as this is going now. You know what I mean? But is there
534 gonna be anything like if I was to get a search warrant for records, notes,
535 recordings, anything from therapists, is anything that was divulged that could
536 possibly involve children?
537
538 A: No.
539
540 Q: Okay.

541
542 A: None.
543
544 Q: The other stuff I don't care.
545
546 A: Yeah.
547
548 Q: It's not my - not my business, not his business, nobody's business. But I just
549 wanna make sure, like...
550
551 A: No. It was...
552
553 Q: ...in no way possible...
554
555 A: No.
556
557 Q: ...that you...
558
559 A: No.
560
561 Q: ...brought up something like that in front of a - a therapist, a counselor...
562
563 A: No.
564
565 Q: ...anything?
566
567 A: No.
568
569 Q: Okay. All right.
570
571 A: Um, the two therapists one was [REDACTED] whatever.
572
573 Q: Okay.
574
575 A: She's in town here. The other one was [REDACTED] is one.
576
577 Q: Okay.
578
579 A: We - I never crossed that line. It was always the role play stuff. She...
580
581 Q: Mm-hm.
582
583 A: ...would have me act stuff out. She would have me - she would, like, have me
584 read things that she found online.
585

586 Q: Mm-hm.
587
588 A: Um, I caught her several times going into my computer and my - my
589 passwords or...
590
591 Q: Okay.
592
593 A: ...or whatever. I mean she didn't work. So she had a lot of time on her hands
594 to...
595
596 Q: Sure.
597
598 A: ...do whatever she wanted to do.
599
600 Q: Okay.
601
602 A: But no.
603
604 Q: Is there anything that you have that you can come up from her, like, you've
605 got on her? 'Cause I know you said you've got a lot.
606
607 A: I could send you...
608
609 Q: I mean I don't know how comfortable you are. But like I said, you know...
610
611 A: If it...
612
613 Q: ...obviously you're...
614
615 A: ...clears me I'm very comfortable with it.
616
617 Q: Okay - okay. I just...
618
619 A: (Unintelligible) public record.
620
621 Q: Un- until - until the basically - once the case is pretty much closed out, you
622 know, uh, that would be something for our attorneys. But a lot of it is public
623 record.
624
625 A: This is just weird, too because we've been separated, divorced for over three
626 years.
627
628 Q: So...
629
630 Q1: So why now?

631
632 Q: Yeah. And what - what does she have to gain? That's what I'm trying to
633 figure out. Why you know what I mean? Obviously I know, you know, I've
634 got enemies just bein' a detective.
635
636 A: Right.
637
638 Q: You know what I mean?
639
640 A: Right.
641
642 Q: But and obviously, you know, you're - you're a big school. You know what I
643 mean? You - you get people that are pissed off that it's - go certain ways. I get
644 it, you know. I don't play politics. I could give a shit less. Um, you know, but
645 obviously when, you know, we talk about these pictures and then the three
646 kids that she's alleging are in the district.
647
648 A: That was - that was her idea. And that was total, like, role play stuff.
649
650 Q: Okay.
651
652 A: And - and...
653
654 Q: But how did that go down?
655
656 A: Um, so we'd talk and night and she - and she, like, used to write stories and
657 read stories.
658
659 Q: Mm-hm.
660
661 A: Like, on, um, there's, like -- I don't know -- Penthouse letters or a different
662 version of that.
663
664 Q: Okay.
665
666 A: So she would write one and she's say, "You take this role and I'll take that
667 role and...
668
669 Q: Okay.
670
671 A: ...read this." You know, it was, like...
672
673 Q: So she...
674
675 A: (Unintelligible).

676
677 Q: ...basically had you read a script?
678
679 A: Yeah.
680
681 Q: And - and...
682
683 A: So.
684
685 Q: ...that involved these three kids? So that's where that came...
686
687 A: (Unintelligible).
688
689 Q: ...from?
690
691 A: She came from, like, I - I've only met those three kids, like, maybe once. I
692 mean I don't even know their names...
693
694 Q: Okay.
695
696 A: ...here or what they would look like.
697
698 Q: Okay.
699
700 A: So that was, like, her little facet.
701
702 Q: So how did that go down though?
703
704 A: Um, in bed one night and she's, like, "Let's act out this scenario or whatever."
705 That's what she said. Yup.
706
707 Q: So she said let's act like we're gettin' - get these three kids?
708
709 A: Yeah, like, I'm gonna go do this. You know, and, you know, what would you
710 say about this or what - I mean this is...
711
712 Q: Mm-hm.
713
714 A: ...five years ago, a couple a years ago whatever. So I have...
715
716 Q: Right.
717
718 A: ...no idea what those - with the pillow talk thing.
719
720 Q: Okay. But that was hers...

721
722 A: That was her...
723
724 Q: (Unintelligible).
725
726 A: ...idea.
727
728 Q: Like, a, you know, like, a - a gut. Okay.
729
730 A: I would never do that to a kid. Mine, others, whatever.
731
732 Q: Okay.
733
734 Q1: Yeah.
735
736 Q: I mean like I said I'm sorry to come here to work and I - but...
737
738 A: No.
739
740 Q: ...these are things we need answers to and...
741
742 A: I - I - I get it.
743
744 Q: I definitely I appreciate you takin' the time to speak with us. Is there anything
745 else that...
746
747 A: It's disgusting. It's whatever.
748
749 Q: Is - is there anything else that we need to know? Um, like I said is something
750 gonna pop up...
751
752 A: Not - not that...
753
754 Q: ...that...
755
756 A: ...I could tell you I mean.
757
758 Q: Okay. (Unintelligible).
759
760 A: I mean I'm glad to answer any questions. I just...
761
762 Q: Oh, no we appreciate that.
763
764 A: (Unintelligible) disgusted whatever. But it's, like, I didn't cross any lines.
765

766 Q: Gotcha. Okay.
767
768 A: I mean she's had mental health issues. She continues to have mental health
769 issues. And that's what I'm supposed to say. That's easy for me to...
770
771 Q: What - what...
772
773 A: ...to tell you that.
774
775 Q: What kind does she have? Uh...
776
777 A: Um, she was sexually mole- and I'm gonna be honest with you. She was
778 sexually molested by her - her, um, stepfather. She was sexually molested by
779 her mother. Um, she was forced to do things with her brother. These are all
780 things that she has told me...
781
782 Q: Okay.
783
784 A: ...over the years. She's estranged from - she had been estranged from all of
785 them.
786
787 Q: Okay.
788
789 A: Um, certain points and times. Um, she's always had a fascination with older
790 men. Um, I mean I got, like, emails.
791
792 Q: Mm-hm.
793
794 A: I - I have videos she has sent me. She has the whole baby thing with guys that
795 she has sent me. So...
796
797 Q: Okay.
798
799 A: ...I mean I have all that if you wanna see it. I'd rather not make it public
800 record. But...
801
802 Q: Sure.
803
804 A: ...I can pull it up whatever. Um, and I created, um, files that just say divorced
805 that I've sent everything to my attorney.
806
807 Q: Okay.
808
809 A: So she sent, um, she did, like, a public record stuff on match.com, Ashley
810 Madison and when Tinder when we were goin' through the divorce and she

811 was actually the one that set up those accounts. And so I'm, like, they come
812 from you or from your intent so then, um, after I sent - after my attorney sent
813 her attorney all the stuff that I have on her then they withdrew all this...

814
815 Q: Okay.

816
817 A: ...all this stuff.

818
819 Q1: So it got kinda ugly...

820
821 A: Yeah.

822
823 Q1: ...goin' through that?

824
825 A: Well no because she made it public when...

826
827 Q1: It didn't need to be.

828
829 A: ...it didn't need to be. And it wasn't even like we were to a bad point yet. And
830 I'm sayin' to my (unintelligible) attorney WTF because...

831
832 Q: Sure. Oh, man.

833
834 Q1: 'Cause that - that's our biggest thing. Like he said, you know, we get flooded
835 with - and we - and we get like you said it created - it means, like, we - we
836 don't care about that. It's just....

837
838 A: I have the one board member who's crazy that maybe you dealt with
839 whatever. I think it's an offshoot of that. I have an aunt who's crazy that is I
840 think maybe aligned herself with my ex, you know, so.

841
842 Q: Okay.

843
844 Q1: Yeah that...

845
846 Q: Okay. Like I said I just - I don't know who exactly has what. I know what
847 we've been given.

848
849 A: Sure.

850
851 Q: Um, you know, and of course there's certain things we have to follow up on.

852
853 A: I - and I - I would want you to. I would expect nothing less.

854
855 Q: Um...

856
857 Q1: You said you don't remember the kids or anything that she would...
858
859 A: I mean I know who she's talkin' about because we were sort of friends with
860 the grandmother that she talked about. And...
861
862 Q: Mm-hm.
863
864 A: ...then she talked about babysitting these kids. And that was always a thing
865 for her, uh, was babysitting kids.
866
867 Q: Mm-hm.
868
869 A: And so...
870
871 Q1: (Unintelligible) kids are.
872
873 A: I - I know what the grandma's name is. Uh, last name is [REDACTED]. Uh, she might
874 be married now. Um, I - I'm assuming that's who she's talking about from,
875 like, four or five years ago.
876
877 Q: Okay.
878
879 A: But...
880
881 Q: Okay.
882
883 A: She had - she had wicked fascinations about being a - a little girl and having
884 little daddy thing goin' on.
885
886 Q: Okay. Um, anything else, like, I mean I'm sure you - you've got enemies that
887 you haven't even heard from yet, you know.
888
889 A: Sure.
890
891 Q: Anybody that sticks out in mind that would be gunning for you, gunning for -
892 other than I talk - I know you talked about, uh, the school board member. But
893 anybody...
894
895 A: (Unintelligible) far right group. I mean...
896
897 Q: Okay.
898
899 A: ...like, you know, like, public education.
900

901 Q: Mm-hm.
902
903 A: It's the whole (Brian Oswald) group. It's the whole, um, tea party group. It's
904 just...
905
906 Q: Mm-hm.
907
908 A: ...the - the extremes to that. That's the only thing I can think of.
909
910 Q: Okay.
911
912 A: Um, besides her and besides, um, like, that one aunt who that's kind of
913 estranged but - but kind of. She's estranged from the rest of the family.
914
915 Q1: Do you know if she's talkin' to your ex?
916
917 A: She was.
918
919 Q1: Yeah?
920
921 A: She was.
922
923 Q1: Okay.
924
925 A: Yup.
926
927 Q1: How'd you find that out?
928
929 A: Um, because her name's [REDACTED].
930
931 Q1: Okay.
932
933 A: And she - ([REDACTED]), um, ([REDACTED]), um, I think sent me an, um, a DM on
934 Facebook. Um, saying -- this was, like, when the - the whole divorce started
935 going down -- saying things to me, like, um, you're just like your dad. Um,
936 you're no better than him. So my dad and mom got divorced 'cause my dad
937 was cheating on her whatever. But our...
938
939 Q1: You said...
940
941 A: ...situation...
942
943 Q1: You said [REDACTED]?
944
945 Q: [REDACTED]?

946
947 A: Not the same family.
948
949 Q: Okay - okay.
950
951 A: It's not.
952
953 Q: Sorry. I was...
954
955 A: Not...
956

969 A: ...don't but I'd be stunned if they were...

971 Q: Okay.

973 A: ...connected. I don't know that for sure.
974
975 Q: Okay.
976
977 A: I don't know that for sure.
978
979 Q1: So her name - her name's [REDACTED]? Your aunt.
980
981 A: Yeah.
982
983 Q1: Okay.
984
985 A: She's married to a doctor. His name's [REDACTED]. Um, live on the east side
986 whatever. So she's, like, my mom's got seven brothers and sisters. She's sort
987 of the black sheep of the family. No one talks to her anymore whatever. So,
988 um, she sent me a DM on Facebook and said, um, "You're no better than your
989 dad. You're, you know, I'm gonna tell everybody whatever."
990

991 Q: (Unintelligible) cheap shots.
992
993 A: But this was, like, three years ago. Yeah. Gettin' cheap shots at me. But the
994 way she framed it, um, it was sort of alluding that - that she had been talking
995 to my ex. So then I sent my ex a message and said, "Are you talking...

997 Q1: Hey what's goin' on?

999 A: ...to ([REDACTED])?" And she goes, "Well I decided to be friends with her" or
1000 something like that or when we were married. Yeah. We weren't together. So

1040 Q: So tell me this. Worst case scenario. Like I said I don't know exactly who's
1041 all got what.

1045 Q: And if, you know, they try to say oh, he's doin' this, he's doin' this, he's doin'
1046 this worst-case scenario would you be willing to take a polygraph as far as the
1047 kid stuff?

1049 A: Absolutely.

1053 A: Yeah.
1054
1055 Q: Okay. Not sayin' we're gonna do that right now.
1056
1057 A: Yeah.
1058
1059 Q: Okay? But, you know, that would be nice to have and I could say
1060 (unintelligible). He took a polygraph. Passed it with flying colors.

1062 A: Never - never - never took pictures of those kids. Never even talked about
1063 those kids except for once that I can remember.
